## 1. Brief description of the Program

The objective of this award is to support and place a master's seeking project in Fine Arts – Drawing in an American University or Art Institute, for the academic year of 2020-2021. In partnership with Fundação Carmona e Costa, the grant endorses the value of art and its role in shaping and enriching today's society. Eligible applicants must have a *licenciatura* degree, good knowledge of the English language, and preferably be under 35 years old. Competition for this grant takes place every two years and selects one grantee.

# 2. Brief analysis of how the promotion, competition and selection process took place (planning, outreach, media, calendars, pool of evaluators, etc).

Competition took place during the months of February and March 2019.

The information about the award was shared in the Fulbright social media: Facebook, Twitter, LinkedIn, Instagram. It was also promoted by Fundação Carmona e Costa, our partner, an institution that invigorates projects of Contemporary Portuguese Art.

During the application process, we replied to inquiries from 4 students.

**2** applications were in-time and fully submitted. Both applications and portfolios were reviewed by a panel of three evaluators, who selected **1** candidate for the next phase of the evaluation process – a visit to the artist's studio. This visit took place on June 5, and after that the applicant passed to the interview phase. The interview took place on June 18 and the evaluators recommended the selection of the candidate.

## 4. Interpretation of the findings

It was noticed a decline of applications for this grant, both submitted and going online: for the academic year (AY) of 2016-2017 there were **6** submitted applications; for the AY 2018-2019 there were **4**; and for the AY of 2020-2021 we received **2** eligible applications. There must be several causes that explain this, but the fact that the competition only opens every two years eventually does not help the dissemination of the award.

Concerning the geographical area, both applications came from Lisbon, which confirms a trend: it is in the capital city where the artistic scene – the presence of art shows and galleries – mostly takes place.
